

EPUT MH & LD Formulary

The Formulary details medicines information on those drugs approved for use within the mental health services of Essex Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, and should be read in conjunction with the Trust's full Formulary and Prescribing Guidelines, containing supporting information to aid in clinical decision making.

Prescribers should always refer to the latest edition of the BNF, BNFc or Summary of Product Characteristics (SPC) for information regarding dosages, contraindications and side effects. The Formulary is a dynamic document, and is regularly reviewed and updated in view of local drug utilisation work, current evidence-based information, and guidance received from NICE.

Classification of Drugs in the Trust

- The majority of drugs prescribed by prescribers in the Trust will be Formulary drugs, with proven efficacy and supporting evidence.
- Some drugs will require specialist knowledge and are required to be initiated by a Consultant or under his/her direct instructions. These are represented as shaded amber.
- Non-Formulary Drugs, highlighted bold blue should not routinely be prescribed. However, they may be
 made available in exceptional circumstances. A completed Non-Formulary Request Form (CLP13 SOP 03New and non-formulary drugs) is required, e.g. if a patient has been maintained on the drug for some time or
 if a consultant wishes to try a drug for an individual patient before requesting inclusion in the formulary.
- Where medicines are included in the formulary, they are approved for their licensed indications and may be prescribed in secondary or primary care EXCEPT hospital-only medicines (amber shading).
- Some preparations of medicines are classed as hospital only medicines (amber shading), and should never
 be prescribed in primary care. For example, an injection used for the management of acutely disturbed
 behaviour might be classified as hospital only, but the oral preparation of the same drug might be
 appropriate for prescribing in either secondary or primary care.
