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Introduction: Therapy Services for Early Years Providers in Southend

Therapy support for early years providers in Southend is provided by both Essex Partnership University NHS Trust (EPUT) and Southend-on-Sea City Council (SCC). Each organisation plays a complementary role in supporting children and young people (CYP).



Southend-on-Sea City Council (SCC) offers universal and targeted services that aim to upskill staff and embed evidence- based approaches across providers. These services are designed to support whole-setting development rather than focusing on individual children.




Essex Partnership University NHS Trust (EPUT) delivers services that include universal and targeted services, as well as individual assessment and intervention for CYP, and contributes to Education, Health and Care Needs Assessments where appropriate.

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To help providers identify and meet the needs of all CYP effectively and early, services are offered across three levels of support:

Universal – Support for all children and young people, including general information and resources. These are valuable for school staff, families, and CYP, including those with needs.
 Targeted – Support for CYP where there are emerging concerns or an identified need. This level typically offers enough input for most CYP and their families.

3. Specialist – Support for CYP with *more*complex or persistent needs. This level includes access to specialist advice, assessment, and intervention. Not all CYP will need specialist support all the time, but it may be essential at key points in their development.



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We are working towards a Balanced System® approach to therapy service delivery across Southend, Essex, and Thurrock. This model supports a whole system approach to joined-up working with settings and strengthens the graduated approach for CYP with SEND. You can find more information about this framework at the end of this document.

Together, we are committed to ensuring our therapies offer to providers has an impact, and we will be monitoring this throughout the academic year through qualitative and quantitative measures. The Balanced System® framework

The Balanced System® framework is a way of making sure that in a setting, school or local area, the right provisions are available for parents, carers and professionals to help children and young people.

In Southend, Essex and Thurrock we are using this framework to help us ensure that therapies provision is planned and delivered in a structured, coordinated way – across universal, targeted and specialist levels – in the right setting, at the right time for the child or young person.

The system provides:

- Continuum of Support: Children can move between the universal, targeted and specialist levels as necessary
- Flexible Pathways: Children and Young People can access support from one or more levels simultaneously depending on their need Integrated Workforce: The
- system emphasises the importance of a collaborative workforce, including specialist professionals and wider staff members to support all levels.
