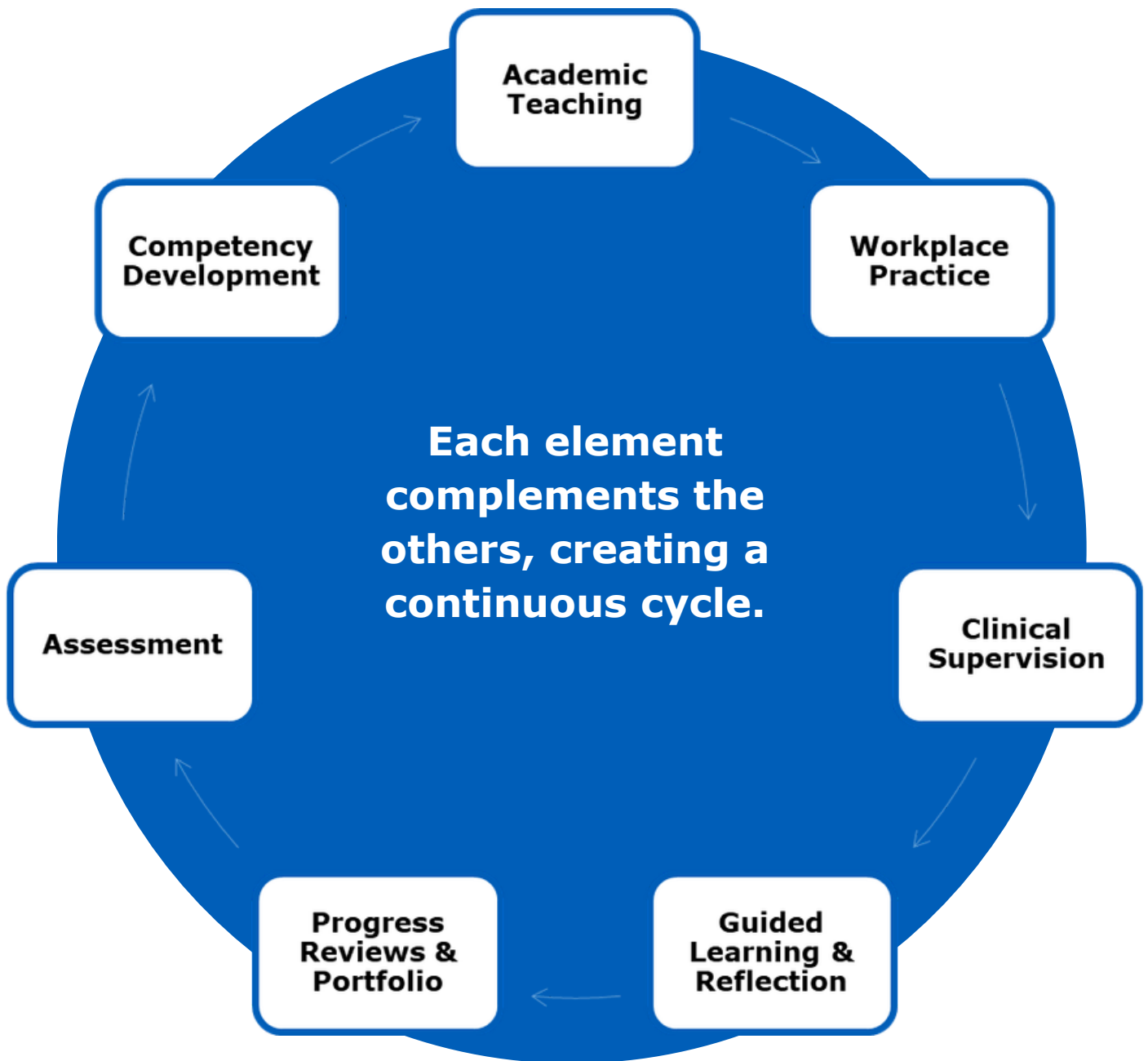

An integrated approach to learning:



Learning on the programme is continuous and interconnected. Academic teaching provides the knowledge base, workplace learning allows apprentices to apply their skills in practice, and clinical supervision supports reflection, development and safe practice. Together, these elements create a structured learning journey that develops competent Clinical Associates in Psychology who are ready to meet the needs of the populations they serve.

The apprentice learning journey

Building strong foundations

Module 1 - Professional Practice & Working in Systems.

Professional identity, ethics, governance, reflective practice and working effectively within health and care systems.

Module 2 - Assessment, Formulation & Presentations.

Developing skills in psychological assessment, formulation and understanding clinical presentations relevant to the apprentice's chosen pathway.

Preparing for qualification

Module 6 - Further Clinical Practice.

Consolidating clinical competencies and demonstrating increasing autonomy within the defined scope of practice.

Module 7 - End Point Assessment.

Demonstrating that the apprentice has achieved the knowledge, skills and behaviours required to practise safely as a Clinical Associate in Psychology.
